### A. Commission Introductions

**B. Commission Review and Rules**

Recreation Manager Nikki Petersen stated that the goal of the Arts Commission is to bring public art to the city. There are to be seven members with three-year terms, staggered so that three members serve for two years at first, the others for three years to prevent all members from terms ending at the same time. There will be a random draw to see which members will serve only two years. Tanea Browning has been appointed as the City Council Liaison. Arts Commission ideas, applications, and recommendations will be presented to City Council.

Meetings will be held quarterly. The next meeting will establish the need for a Chairperson.

Many ideas for art projects were suggested.

The former Banner Bank has a blank wall where they would like a mural. Maybe look at something made out of vinyl.

School children want a way of displaying their art. Installing art along fences at the school or an art walk would be good options.

The triangle area at Freeman and E Pine needs something other than bare dirt.

Art that is useful and helps with visibility or safety would be nice such as motion lighting for dark areas that showcase murals, interactive trash cans, etc.

The sun dial at Crater High has been damaged. We would like to get student input to see if they would like it repaired or replaced with something different.

There have been mosaics around downtown for years. At least one is missing and needs replaced.
